


PRESIDENTS REPORT

Presidents Annual Report 2020

Regretfully 2020 will most likely be remembered for reasons other than club achievements and surf lifesaving success.

This season at Soldiers Beach has been no less challenging, however, our membership has continued to patrol, compete and support the local community. This season Soldiers Beach Surf Club had 351 members. Our 78 patrolling members completed over 4400 patrol hours, performing 47 rescues & over 4300 preventative actions for close on 80,000 visitors to our beach.

Two of our patrolling members, Matt Neale and Ian McGaw, received National awards for rescues performed.

Soldiers Beach was represented at all our local Junior carnivals and contributed a strong contingent of Masters to both local and State competition with medals at the NSW titles. Our representation in lifesaving events was down on previous seasons, however, our club was well represented by our boat crews with both Ladies and Mens reserve crews along with 2 Male masters crews.

Our nipper membership, although down on previous seasons, continues to achieve their educational goals and develop their skills. The dedication of our age managers, water safety and nipper management team should be noted along with the efforts of our trainers and coaches who give so freely of their time to ensure the success of the nipper program.

Our Surf Education team continues to produce lifesavers and up skill our patrols with Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, First Aid and Advanced Resus techniques courses held over the season. This season saw a different mode of delivery for our Bronze Medallion/SRC course with the candidates integrated into patrols to assist with the award process. This formula proved to be a success with the majority of award members continuing on to patrols, boosting numbers and providing a much higher rate of retention. The Education team continues to review Surf Ed presentation in an effort to maintain retention of members and attract potential new candidates to surf lifesaving.

2020 has also been a successful year for Soldiers Beach gaining a number of grants throughout the season with the assistance of SLSA Grants Unit. Soldiers Beach has received funding from the NSW Club Grants for equipment along with the Federal Government Stronger Communities grant for upgrades to the building electrical system. The most recent grant success has been from the NSW Govt Community Building Partnership grant for various works around the club building including painting.

Our sponsors continue to be lifeblood for the club. Wyong Rugby Leagues Club Group, Halekulani Bowling Club, Delta Electricity and Toukley RSL have all been major contributors this season along with Branch sponsors Fortunity and Freemasons Central Coast. The support of these sponsors is crucial to the club and our thanks go to these groups for their ongoing support.

This has been the first year for our new commercial operator Dunes. It has been a successful build up for the first season with increased trade and much appreciated support from Dunes. It is hoped that the current situation is a short term set back and that the doors will be open again soon.

Our new kiosk, The Kraken, has also been a successful addition to Soldiers Beach SLSC this season. Thanks to the Kraken for their support. It is certain that 2020 has been a challenging year.

While the club continues to have its financial challenges ahead; lifesaving, surf sports and junior development continue. The committee continues to work towards fostering strong community contacts and developing a business model that will serve the club into the future.

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

There would not be one Charity / Service / Sporting Club large or small who have not been impacted negatively by the world wide corona virus. In our case due to small cash reserves held by the club and the uncertainty of our partnerships a close look at our activities has been undertaken. We are proud to say that at this time our current partners are committed to fully going forward with no significant impact on our budgeted forecast financial situation.

The Club from last season's financial result was sticking to very tight budgeting, committing fully to the payment plan's put in place with our creditors. The day to day activities of the surf lifesaving club including patrolling and junior activities are to be commended for providing a top-class service without unnecessary expenditure. We have sought advice ongoing with Fortunity as well as Ian Fullagar our Legal Counsel constantly to progress our current situation in the best interest of our members.

We are currently working towards the consolidation of our current debt. We plan to put in place a series of fundraising activities to bring in much needed cash flow.

What the club needs is Member's to assist in patrolling the Central Coasts best beach. If every member introduced one new member for this coming season, we would double our membership. We need sponsorships for the general running of our club - so any introduction to friends or companies who would like to come on board would be greatly appreciated. We would guarantee they would be treated well.

Thanks must go to President Jim Buckton for his outstanding service and commitment to the club, he is an outstanding man who works tirelessly on behalf of the club. Thank You to Gail Rixom and Emma Dennis for their great contribution to the ongoing financial activities of the club. A special mention should also go to Fortunity and Surf Life Saving Central Coast for providing much needed financial and administrative advice.

DIRECTOR OF SURF LIFESAVING

2019/20 at Soldiers Beach has been another busy season with 4420 volunteer hours spent on the beach over a shortened season which finished 3 weeks early. Soldiers Beach volunteer patrols performed 47 rescues with a couple worthy of note which were nominated for rescue of the month. Soldiers 78 patrolling members were this season spread over a six patrol roster with one reserve or roving patrol. This was a reduction in patrol numbers from last season, however, was required to maintain patrol strengths and provide the public with adequate patrol numbers on the beach. This meant that most patrols were on the beach 2 weeks out of every three. This was a big ask for our patrolling members and it is hoped that the restructure of patrols will continue to ease the burden on our active members.

This season a new implementation of the Bronze & SRC training courses was tested and proved to be a success. Bronze & SRC trainees were integrated into the patrols for the bulk of the training and remained with the patrols once their award was complete. This season those new patrol members will continue their surf lifesaving training with the provision of other courses such as first aid, ARTC and spinal management to supplement the patrol skills on the beach.

Patrol Captains this season were asked to complete an online pre-season refresher from SLSNSW and this was discussed at the Patrol & Vice Captains meeting prior to the season start. Training & instruction was also provided on the use of the SLSNSW Patrol Operations App. The use of this is improving each season and is a valuable, timesaving tool for patrol operations.

This season there was a focus on retention and this has seen most of our trainees remain with the patrol teams. It has also seen a small increase in our younger patrol members & this will be a focus point for the 20/21 season as these members progress to be senior patrol members. This will see some new blood in positions to gain experience on the beach and increase patrol numbers into the future. Integration with the Education team in the provision of lifesaving services on the beach will continue given the success of these efforts this season.

The effort and dedication from our patrol members this season is to be congratulated along with a couple of members for their outstanding efforts during the season. Again, Neville Bunn was our nomination for Patrol person of the year along with Hannah Hopwood as our Junior patrol person of the year for the SLSCC awards of excellence. And a congratulations goes to Craig Ray for his Branch Award of RWC operator of the year.

A thank you to all of our patrol members, Captains, Vice Captains, IRB Drivers & crews, our rookies and trainers for a very successful patrol season and remember that regals will start in early September 2020.

DIRECTOR OF SURF EDUCATION

The 2019/20 season has been a very bumpy one for the Education Team. The season started well but like many aspects of life was impacted by COVID-19 pandemic. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our members for their ongoing support. Our team for 19/20 is appears below:

The new system for completing requals, which was trialled successfully last session, before and during the season went well with land-based sessions offered, online learning and on the beach demonstration of skills and competencies. The dates were set early and the use of social media and the Soldiers web page was used to inform patrolling members of the dates. After a review from last season the following items were added: registration, uniform allocation, competencies analysis and patrol confirmations. The additional items ensured each member has registered for the season and is competent and allowing for time to review any skills in more depth if required.

This season has seen the implementation of an education program closely linked with the needs of the club and formulated with close collaboration from the Junior Activities and Lifesaving portfolios. Unfortunately, this season we did not get the required numbers to run a Parent Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) course. However, we will try again next season and aim to advertise this much earlier so people are able to have the time need to train for this course.

This season we changed how we facilitated training for BM and SRC courses. Firstly, we held one - two beach days and then allocated people to a Patrol from the beginning of the course. Whilst on Patrol the candidates were able to learn as they went from the Patrol members. This enabled the candidates to connect with their Patrol at the start of the course, apply Patrol related activity to the learning and get a better appreciated of the reality of Patrolling as opposed to going onto Patrol at the end of the course and then trying to develop relationships with their Patrol. These relationships are already formed and beginning to embed. The evaluation of this as been positive and this will continue into next season.

With this in mind we had planned to facilitate, train and assess two Bronze Medallion courses and two SRC courses. However, we were only able to complete one at the beginning of the season. The team also planned for First Aid and an Advanced Resuscitation courses to be held but due to low responses and COVID-19 these were not held.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who make themselves available to the Education Team and willingly share their skills and experience with our students. It really adds to the quality of the courses to have such experience readily available. And a big thank you to all those who have helped with water safety, scenario training, swim and board training.
