

4WD Vehicle Guideline & Gear Requirements

- 1. The only people permitted to drive the 4WD are Members who hold a current drivers license AND who have been inducted in the correct use of the 4WD.
- 2. While driving the 4WD on the beach it is a requirement to minimise speed, have the headlights, hazard lights and flashing yellow light on at all times. Seat belts must also to be worn.

Note; Lifesaving vehicles are not exempt from being fined so please abide with the law at all times.

3. THE TIRE PRESSURE FOR USE ON THE BEACH IS 16PSI AND MUST BE CHECKED AT THE START OF EACH AM PATROL.

NOTE: The vehicle should not be driven any faster than 20kph with this tire pressure and care should be used when cornering and braking the vehicle.

4. Mandatory equipment for the 4WD while on patrol is as follows;

SLS two way radio in the cab. Rescue board on the roof rack.

In the Blue Box

- a) Oxy Viva unit
- b) Defibrillator, ZOLL (the new green coloured one)
- c) First Aid Kit Small
- d) Binoculars Surf Lifesaving branded
- e) Rescue Tube
- f) Fins 1 x small, 1 x medium, 1 x large
- g) Picnic Blanket (for use with the Defib)

NOTE: The Oxy Viva and Defibrillator are to be put in the blue box on Saturday morning and removed from the box and stored in the First Aid Room at the end of the Sunday PM patrol. All other items are to remain permanently in the box.

- At the completion of EVERY PM patrol the 4WD is to be thoroughly hosed all over ensuring that all the sand and salt spray has been removed.
 The sand must be removed from the inside of the vehicle at the completion of EVERY PM patrol.
- 6. If there is a need to drive the vehicle on the road then before doing so the tires must be inflated to normal road going pressure (32PSI) and the yellow flashing light must be turned off.
